Match background

Bayer 04 Leverkusen could not face a more formidable threat to their hopes of reaching their first UEFA Champions League quarter-final in a decade as they welcome FC Barcelona for their round of 16 first-leg tie.

- The fact that Josep Guardiola's holders have averaged four goals a game on their travels underlines the size of the task for Robin Dutt's men, who finished ahead of another Spanish side, Valencia CF, in the group stage.

Previous meetings

- Leverkusen had never faced Spanish opponents before taking on Barcelona in the quarter-finals of their triumphant 1987/88 UEFA Cup campaign. Milton Tita scored the tie's only goal past Andoni Zubizarreta, now Barcelona's sporting director, in the second leg at the Camp Nou and Erich Ribbeck's side went on to beat RCD Espanyol in the final.

- The teams traded 2-1 home wins when they met again in the 2001/02 UEFA Champions League first group stage, with Michael Ballack lining up against Carles Puyol and Xavi Hernández.

- Barcelona won 2-1 in Leverkusen and 2-0 at home in the following season's second group stage. Puyol, Xavi and Andrés Iniesta featured for the Blaugrana.

Match background

- Group E runners-up Leverkusen are bidding to reach the last eight for the first time since 2001/02, when they advanced to the final before losing to Real Madrid CF.

- Leverkusen posted three straight home wins in the group stage, including a 2-1 success against Valencia, but have reason to be wary of Spanish opposition. In last season's UEFA Europa League they won four of six home games, but the two exceptions were against Club Atlético de Madrid (1-1) in the group stage and Villarreal CF (2-3), their nemesis in the last 16.

- Leverkusen's overall home record against Spanish opposition is W5 D3 L4.

- Group H winners Barcelona scored 12 goals in their three away games in that section and have lost just one of their last nine European fixtures on their travels.

- Barcelona's last seven trips to Germany have yielded four wins and three draws, their last loss that 2001 reverse in Leverkusen. Their most recent visit was in the 2009/10 round of 16 when they drew 1-1 with VfB Stuttgart en route to a 5-1 aggregate success. Their overall away record against German teams is W8 D10 L5.

- Barcelona beat Fortuna Düsseldorf to win the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup in 1979.

Team ties

- Guardiola's first four appearances in Europe's premier club competition as a player came against FC Hansa Rostock and 1. FC Kaiserslautern in autumn 1991. Barcelona, that season's eventual winners, won both home legs but lost both away.

- Ballack was in the Chelsea FC side denied a UEFA Champions League final place in the 2008/09 semi-finals by Iniesta's added-time equaliser in a 1-1 draw in London that earned Barcelona an away-goals victory. Ballack had helped Chelsea finish above Barcelona in the 2006/07 group stage with a 1-0 home win and 2-2 away draw.

- In the UEFA EURO 2008 final Ballack's Germany lost 1-0 to the Spain of Puyol, Xavi, Iniesta and Cesc Fàbregas. Puyol's header earned Spain another 1-0 win against Germany in the 2010 FIFA World Cup semi-finals.

- Eren Derdiyok and Tranquillo Barnetta helped Switzerland shock Spain 1-0 in their opening match in South Africa. Besides Puyol, Xavi and Iniesta, Gerard Piqué, Sergio Busquets, David Villa and Pedro Rodríguez were also in Spain's side.

- Derdiyok and Barnetta were brought down to earth by Alexis Sánchez's Chile in their next match, succumbing 1-0.

- Michal Kadlec was in the Czech Republic team beaten in a UEFA EURO 2012 qualifier in March 2011 by the two Villa goals with which the Barcelona striker became Spain's record scorer.

- Daniel Alves and Adriano were part of the Sevilla FC side that beat Manuel Friedrich's 1. FSV Mainz 05 2-0 on aggregate in the first round of the 2005/06 UEFA Cup.

- Alves and Renato Augusto are Brazil team-mates. They lined up together in a 3-2 friendly loss to Germany in August 2011, with Leverkusen's André Schürrle and Simon Rolfes featuring as substitutes for Germany and the former scoring.

- Leverkusen, with Kadlec suspended, suffered a loss that leaves them with only one win in seven outings in all competitions.
- It was Leverkusen's second loss in 12 fixtures since their defeat at Valencia CF on 1 November, though six of those games ended in draws.
- Robin Dutt's side have kept only five clean sheets in their last 23 matches in all competitions.
- On 4 February, Vedran Ćorluka made his club debut as Leverkusen were held 2-2 by VfB Stuttgart, conceding an 89th-minute equaliser after Kadlec had been dismissed (63).

Injury news

- Sidney Sam will miss the Barcelona tie. He suffered a muscle injury during Leverkusen's training camp in Lagos, Portugal from 4-13 January. He returned as a substitute against Stuttgart but lasted 12 minutes before being withdrawn with a thigh problem.
- Ballack will also sit out the first leg having suffered a calf injury in training on Sunday.
- Renato Augusto replaced Sam, his first appearance since undergoing knee surgery in late October. He came on again on Saturday.
- Derdiyok has been out since 2 February, when he trod on a shard of glass while at home and required seven stitches in his foot.
- First-choice goalkeeper René Adler has been sidelined since undergoing knee surgery in mid-July.
- Tranquillo Barnetta has not played since 4 June because of a persistent right knee problem.

- Barcelona have conceded 397 goals in UEFA competition.

UEFA Champions League statistics

- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the group stage, equalling a record set by Manchester United FC in 1998/99.
- Barça have had more shots wide (57) and won more corners (41) than any other team in the round of 16. They have committed the fewest fouls (61) along with Chelsea FC and collected only nine yellow cards, the joint lowest total among the teams remaining along with AC Milan.
- Lionel Messi has scored six goals, the joint highest total in the competition along with Mario Gomez.
- Messi has had more shots on goal (17) than any other player; his tally of 19 shots wide is more than anyone still involved.

- Carles Puyol's next booking will incur a suspension.

- Josep Guardiola's side's 18-match unbeaten run, 14 of them wins, ended against an Osasuna side they beat 8-0 in September. It was Barcelona's second loss in 47 outings following a 1-0 defeat at Getafe CF on 26 November.
- Saturday marked the first time in 70 games that Barcelona have conceded three goals in a game, since a 3-1 Copa del Rey defeat at Real Betis Balompié on 19 January 2011.
- Before Saturday, Puyol had gone 56 games without defeat for Barcelona, since the 3-1 2009/10 UEFA Champions League semi-final loss at FC Internazionale Milano.
- Guardiola's charges will meet Athletic Club in May's Copa del Rey final after aggregate victories over third-tier CE L'Hospitalet (including a 9-0 second-leg win), Osasuna, Real Madrid CF and Valencia CF.
- Barcelona are 47 games unbeaten at home, winning 40 since a 2-0 loss to Hércules CF on 11 September 2010.
- Barcelona went 1,112 minutes without conceding a goal at home, keeping a club record 12 clean sheets and scoring 55 without reply at the Camp Nou, before Rubén Castro struck for Betis on 15 January.
- Messi has scored 22 goals in his last 25 games for club and country.
- Barcelona went top of the Liga on goal difference by beating Real Madrid on 10 December but they have since slipped well adrift of the Merengues.
- The Catalan giants won the FIFA Club World Cup for the second time on 18 December, beating Brazil's Santos FC 4-0 in the final in Japan.
- It sealed Barcelona's third trophy this season. They beat FC Porto 2-0 in the UEFA Super Cup on 26 August having already wrapped up a 5-4 aggregate victory against Real Madrid in the Spanish Super Cup.

Injury news

- Pedro Rodríguez returned to action at Osasuna after four games out with strained adductors.
- Sergio Busquets has been out of action with a bruised knee since 4 February.
- Andrés Iniesta returned from a hamstring injury as a late substitute last Wednesday as Barça beat Valencia 2-0 to wrap up a 3-1 aggregate success in the Copa del Rey semi-finals.
- David Villa could miss the rest of the season after breaking his left leg in the Club World Cup semi-final defeat of Qatar's al-Sadd Sports Club on 15 December. Andreu Fontàs will not feature until 2012/13 after tearing knee ligaments on 12 January.
- Ibrahim Afellay remains sidelined after suffering a knee ligament injury in training in September.

- Seydou Keita has been on Africa Cup of Nations duty, ever-present as Mali finished third after beating Ghana on Saturday.
- In January, Éric Abidal and José Pinto signed one-year contract extensions tying them to the club until June 2013. Isaac Cuenca has committed until summer 2015.
- Messi collected the FIFA Ballon d'Or for the third successive year on 9 January, beating Cristiano Ronaldo and Xavi Hernández in the poll. Guardiola was named men's coach of the year.
- Guardiola was also named coach of the UEFA.com users' Team of the Year, a side captained by Xavi and also containing Daniel Alves, Gerard Piqué, Iniesta and Messi.

- One of the new breed of German coaches whose second career has eclipsed modest playing days, Dutt rose through the ranks of several clubs in southern Germany as he methodically learned his trade.
- From 1995 to 1999 he was player-coach at non-league Leonberg, whom he led to promotion before taking over Ditzingen's reserves, becoming coach of their first team, then in the fourth tier, in 2000. Two years later accepted the offer to take charge of the reserve side of former Bundesliga outfit Stuttgarter Kickers, stepping up to the third tier and the first team a year later.
- Awarded the UEFA Pro Licence as top of his class in 2005, the same year he guided Stuttgarter Kickers to the first of successive victories in the regional Württemberg Cup. Thus qualified for the first round of the national trophy, his side duly knocked out Hamburger SV in September 2006.
- Having already been linked with several higher-profile clubs, Dutt took over Freiburg in summer 2007, finishing fifth in the 2. Bundesliga in his first season before winning the division, and promotion to the top flight, a year later.
- Took Freiburg to 14th position in the Bundesliga in 2009/10 and led the club to sixth place at the halfway stage of the following campaign; they eventually finished ninth, earning Dutt the chance to take charge of Leverkusen.

FC Barcelona: Josep Guardiola

Coaching career: FC Barcelona B, FC Barcelona

- Known as 'Pep', he came up through Barcelona's youth ranks to win six Spanish Liga titles, one European Champion Clubs' Cup, a UEFA Cup Winners' Cup and two Copa del Rey trophies from 1990 to 2001. Also had spells with Brescia, Fabio Capello's Roma, Al-Ahly in Doha and Mexico's Dorados de Sinola before ending his playing career in 2006.
- Won 40 caps and Olympic footballing gold with Spain in 1992, but missed the 1998 and 2002 FIFA World Cup tournaments through injury.
- Having coached Barcelona's B team, became the 15th Catalan-born boss of the senior team in 2008 and won the UEFA Champions League, Spanish Liga and Copa del Rey in his first season in charge.
- Success in the 2008/09 final made Guardiola the sixth man to lift the European Cup as a player and a coach. Barcelona followed up with victories in the Spanish and UEFA Super Cups at the start of 2009/10, going on to win the FIFA Club World Cup and retain the Liga title.
- Steered the Azulgrana to a third successive Liga crown and their fourth European Cup in 2010/11.

- Craig Thomson has put the judgement he has acquired as a lawyer to good use to become a promising international referee.
- Thomson, who has been officiating since the age of 16 and counts golf, reading and cinema among his hobbies, made his first foray into international refereeing in spring 2003 when he took charge of two UEFA European Under-19 Championship elite round fixtures.
- That September he refereed his first competitive U21 game and stepped up to the UEFA Champions League first qualifying round in summer 2004. Thomson made his FIFA World Cup qualifying debut that September and also featured in UEFA EURO 2008 qualifying, subsequently acting as fourth official in three group matches at the final tournament.
- He officiated at three UEFA Cup matches in 2006/07 and took charge of two games at the 2007 UEFA European U21 Championship finals before making his UEFA Champions League group stage debut when Rosenborg BK played Valencia CF in October 2007, going on to make regular appearances over subsequent seasons.
- Thomson also worked at the FIFA U-17 World Cup in the Korea Republic the same year, although his career highlights remain three 'Old Firm' games between Celtic FC and Rangers FC, the 2007, 2010 and 2011 Scottish League Cup finals and the 2009 Scottish Cup final.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through on 24 occasions although only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's win against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they lost 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty ties have been decided on the away goals rule, including six where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for the biggest first-leg lead with a 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 first knockout round, eventually going through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg. Those two games also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any previous UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Ten ties have gone to penalties, including the game between Arsenal FC and AS Roma in the 2008/09 round of 16. Five of these were finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2008. The first two-legged tie decided on spot-kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- In all, 17 ties have required extra time. So far seven have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, two first knockout round encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Ten have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Tottenham Hotspur FC's narrow victory against AC Milan in the 2010/11 round of 16.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983) and José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United FC lost the 2011 final in London. Five teams won Champion Clubs' Cup finals on home soil: Real Madrid CF (1957), FC Internazionale Milano (1965), Manchester United FC (1968), AFC Ajax (1972) and Liverpool FC (1978), while Stade de Reims Champagne (1956), AS Roma (1984) and FC Barcelona (1986) all lost finals in their own country.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6 of the 2007/08 edition.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 148 days, in Manchester United's 2-0 win at FC Schalke 04 on 26 April 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
